2019 JUNIOR STATE CHAMPIONSHIP REGULATIONS



THE CHAMPIONSHIP

The Championship will be conducted by a promoter/s as appointed for 2019 by Motorcycling Western Australia.

The Motocross Sporting Panel will select events for the Junior, Quad and Girl's championship as the State Junior Motocross Championship rounds.

The competition will be conducted under Motorcycling Australia permit as issued by MWA and run under the rules as stated in the 2019 MA Manual of Motorcycle Sport, these State Championship Regulations and the event Supplementary Regulations.

There will be a minimum of three heats for each championship class conducted at each round.

Points will be awarded in each championship heat in accordance with the 2019 MA Manual of Motorcycle Sport.

If any State Championship heats are cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the Championship can be declared on the completion of a minimum 66% of the scheduled heats for the entire 2019 Championship.

ELIGIBLE COMPETITORS

Entries will only be received from holders of a current "Junior National" Motorcycling Australia competition licence.

ELIGIBLE MACHINES/CLASSES

State Championships will be contested for classes as follows:

- 50cc Auto 7-u9 years - 6 Rounds**
- 65cc 7-u10 years** - will be merged with 10-u12 years class if not enough to constitute a class - 6 Rounds
- 65cc 10-u12 years** - will be merged with 7-u10 years class if not enough to constitute a class -6 Rounds
- 85cc 2 Stroke/150cc 4 Stroke 9- U12 Yrs. – 6 Rounds**
- 85cc 2 Stroke/150 cc 4 Stroke 12-U16 Yrs – 6 Rounds**
- 100-125cc 2 Stroke 13-u16 Years - 6 Rounds**
- 128-150cc 2 stroke / 200-250cc 4 Stroke 13-u16 - 6 Rounds**
Girls 85cc 2 Stroke BW/150cc 4 Stroke BW/100-150cc 2 stroke/200-250cc 4 Stroke 12-u16yrs.-
3 rounds
- Girls 65cc 85cc std 7 – u12yrs 3 Rounds
- Quad - 60cc-90cc 2 Stroke Limited/85cc-110cc 4 Stroke Limited 7-U11 Yrs 6 Rounds**
- Quad - 60cc-90cc 2 Stroke Competition/ 85cc-125cc 4 Stroke Competition 9-U13Yrs 6 Rounds**

□ **Quad - Up to 200cc 2 Stroke Competition/ Up to 250cc 4 Stroke Competition 13-U16
Yrs 6 Rounds**

Quad Limited and Quad Competition class (60-90cc / 85-110/125cc four stroke) will race together, double entering of these classes will not be accepted, this class will not be split under any circumstances

The classes will be set from the first round where the minimum numbers are met to establish the class as set out above (if a class has failed to establish after the first two rounds it will be removed from the Championship for the remainder of the year). Once set, classes will not be altered. If there are insufficient numbers, age groups and classes may be combined or separated at the discretion of the promoter

Once the classes of competition are defined for 2019, they will remain unchanged for each round. Some classes may be combined for racing but each championship class will be scored separately.

Age groups will be determined on the age the rider will be on January 1. A rider can elect to ride up to a higher age class when they have their birthday, however cannot go back.

RACE CONDITIONS

Race timings and formats will be at the promoters discretion as is allowed within the GCR's. The format to be used for the individual Championship rounds will be advised by the Promoter in the supplementary regulations for each round.

. The 50cc Demo Class may be a support class, time permitting.

MAXIMUM NUMBERS

A maximum number of FORTY (40) solo and TWENTY (20) quad entries per class will participate in each championship heat.(combined total of 20 for the combined Quad class)

Should there be more entries for a class than there are places, qualifying will be held. The method of qualifying will be stipulated in Supplementary Regulations.

MINIMUM NUMBERS

A minimum of 10 solos (5 for girl's solos) and a minimum of 5 quads must be bona fide starters for points to be accumulated towards the Championship. This minimum will be determined from the number of riders starting practice.

SUPPORT CLASSES

Support classes may be conducted at the discretion of the Promoter/s and will be stipulated in Supplementary Regulations.

AWARDS

Awards will be presented by Motorcycling Western Australia to the first 3 overall place getters in each State Championship class upon completion of the season.

These will be presented at the 2019 Motorcycling Western Australia Night of Champions. All place getters are expected to attend.

SEEDED NUMBERS - SOLO

The top **5** Seeded riders in the **100-125cc 2 Stroke 13-u16 Years** class will be awarded certificates and **may elect** to run their seeded numbers in 2020.

The top **3** Seeded riders from 2018 **may elect** to run their seeded numbers in this year's championship.

The number that has been selected for the first round entered **MUST** be used for the remainder of the series.

These plates can only be used in 2019 when competing in the **100-125cc 2 Stroke 13-u16 Years** or **100-125cc 2 Stroke 13-u16 Years** class as appropriate.

SEEDED NUMBERS – QUAD

The top **3** Seeded riders in the 200cc 2 stoke- 250cc 4 stroke 13 to under 16 class will be awarded certificates and **may elect** to run their seeded numbers in 2020.

The top 3 seeded riders from 2018 may elect to run their seeded numbers in this year's championship.

The number that has been selected for the first round entered MUST be used for the remainder of the series.

These plates can only be used in 2019 when competing in the 200cc 2 stoke- 250cc 4 stroke 13 to under 16 class

SEEDED NUMBERS – GIRL'S SOLO

The top 3 Seeded riders in the **Girls 85cc 2 Stroke BW/150cc 4 Stroke BW/100-150cc 2 stroke/200-250cc 4 Stroke 12-u16yrs** class will be awarded certificates and **may elect** to run their seeded numbers in 2020.

The top **3** Seeded riders from 2018 **may elect** to run their seeded numbers in this year's championship.

The number that has been selected for the first round entered MUST be used for the remainder of the series.

These plates can only be used in 2019 when competing in the **Girls 85cc 2 Stroke BW/150cc 4 Stroke BW/100-150cc 2 stroke/200-250cc 4 Stroke 12-u16yrs** class.

TRACK CLOSURES

The Club hosting a Championship round must close the track to all motorcycle activity from midnight Sunday prior to the event and the track must meet the guidelines as per the track license as issued by MWA
